

## EDITORIAL NOTES

The source of Sonata IV in G minor [C 54] is a manuscript included in: “*Recueil de sonates et de différentes pièces / Louis- Nicolas Clérambault*”, Ensemble documentaire: Brossard, Bibliothèque nationale de France, département Musique, VM7-1157.

The edition includes mistakes and omission of ornaments and accidentals. All suggestions of the editor are in parentheses or with dashed lines. The parts in soprano, mezzosoprano and french clef were transcribed in violin or alto clef.

The cover page includes the incipit from manuscript.

The version 1.0 has been published on December 23, 2019.
