## NOTE EDITORIALI

L'edizione antica a stampa del Trio Wq 161/2 [1748], disponibile presso la University of Rochester Library, riporta la seguente intestazione: “*ZWEY TRIO, / das erste für / zwey VIOLINEN und BASS, / das zweyte für / I. QUERFLÖTE, I. VIOLINE und BASS, / bey welchen beyden aber die eine von den / Oberstimmen auch auf dem Flügel / gespielt werden kan: / ... / von / Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach / Königl. Preussischen Cammer Musicus. / Nürnberg...*”.

L'edizione antica è molto scrupolosa, con pochissime sviste. Qualche incertezza nella lettura delle legature è stata risolta per analogia. Se non altrimenti indicato, i rari interventi dell'editore sono sempre tra parentesi [ ] o ( ).

In copertina è riportato l'incipit del primo movimento dell'edizione del 1748.

La versione 1.0 è stata completata il 6 febbraio 2008. La prima revisione (versione 1.1), che corregge omissioni nella dinamica e uniforma le legature, è del 17 febbraio 2008. La versione 1.5 dell'8 marzo 2013 presenta un nuovo formato editoriale.

## EDITORIAL NOTES

Source of Trio Wq 161/2 is a 1748 printed edition available at University of Rochester Library, with caption title: “*ZWEY TRIO, / das erste für / zwey VIOLINEN und BASS, / das zweyte für / I. QUERFLÖTE, I. VIOLINE und BASS, / bey welchen beyden aber die eine von den / Oberstimmen auch auf dem Flügel / gespielt werden kan: / ... / von / Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach / Königl. Preussischen Cammer Musicus. / Nürnberg...*”.

The printed edition is almost flawless. Some ambiguities with slurs have been solved by analogy. All additions of the editor are between ( ) or [ ] or with dashed slurs or ties.

Cover includes copy of first movement incipit from ancient edition.

Version 1.0 has been published on February 6, 2008. Version 1.1 with some corrections on slurs and dynamics has been published on February 17, 2008. Version 1.5 (February 8, 2013) has a revised editorial format.
