



## EDITORIAL NOTES

The Quatrième Suite in D major includes fifteen instrumental pieces and a chaconne. Francœur arranged his own music and music of other authors. The source is the autograph of the score included in a collection of suites with caption title: “*Symphonie du Festin Royal // de Monseigneur Le Comte d'Artois, année 1773. [Le plat de la couverture porte :] Concert François arrangé par Mr Francœur... pour le Festin Royal de M.gr le Comte d'Artois année 1773.*” Signature: Bibliothèque nationale de France, département Musique, H-383 (2).

The source is almost flawless, except for the usual omissions of accidentals and ornaments. All editor suggestions are in parentheses. The parts in soprano and in mezzosoprano clefs have been published with violin or alto clef.
