la fonte di riferimento è lo sviluppo (Auflösung) del Canone a 4, presente nell'edizione della Musikalisches Opfer del 1885 curata dalla Bach-Gesellschaft zu Leipzig (Band 31, curatore Alfred Dörffel), basato sull'edizione a stampa dell'opera curata da Bach stesso nel 1747. L'originale di Bach riporta solo la prima parte in chiave di violino francese seguita dalla chiave di Basso, senza indicare i punti d'entrata delle altre voci.

I rari interventi dell'editore sono tra parentesi () o [] e con legature tratteggiate.

In copertina è riportato il canone nella versione originale, tratto dall'edizione 1885.

La versione 1.0 è stata pubblicata il 1 gennaio 2009.

EDITORIAL NOTES

Source is the development (Auflösung) of "Canon a 4", Musikalisches Opfer, 1885 edition, Bach-Gesellschaft zu Leipzig (Band 31, editor Alfred Dörffel), based on the 1747 printed edition revised by Bach himself. The original presents only the first part in french clef, followed immediately by a bass clef, without indication of entry points of the other parts.

Unless otherwise indicated, the interventions of the editor are always in brackets [] or () or with dashed lines.

Cover includes the original version of Canon as it appears in 1885 edition.

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
